MESSAGE FROM CHIEF HALES

The Spanish Fork Fire & EMS department continues to grow to meet the needs of the city. This past year our city council approved hiring three full-time battalion chiefs. This addition allows the department to have management/supervision of staffed personnel at both fire stations as well as a dedicated incident commander on all major fire & EMS incidents.



City council also approved the hiring of three full-time AEMT's and three full-time firefighter/AEMT's. These additions will allow one ambulance to be staffed with full-time employees consistently, one ambulance to remain staffed with part-time employees 24/7/365, and one ambulance to be staffed during peak hours 7 am- 7 pm by part-time employees. The addition of the full-time staff will allow consistency and continuity amongst our team, create accountability, and provide a higher level of service to the community.

The Fire & EMS department has 114 employees (5 – Full-Time Administrative Staff, 3 - Full-Time Battalion Chiefs, 12 – Full-Time Firefighter/Paramedics, 3 - Full-Time Firefighter/AEMT's, 3 - Full-Time AEMT's, 53 – Part-Time EMS, 35 – Volunteer Firefighters. Our personnel take great pride serving the citizens, businesses, and visitors to Spanish Fork City "The Home of Pride & Progress".

I am extremely humbled and honored to work with so many dedicated hardworking team members who strive to provide a premier quality of life for our community. Regardless of your needs, our firefighters, paramedics, AEMT's, and administrative staff stand ready to preserve, serve, and save lives and property.

Spanish Fork Fire & EMS is grateful for the support of those in our community. As we continue to grow, our fire and EMS services will need to grow as well to accompany that growth. The continued support from the community is needed so our services can be at the highest level possible for each of you.

FIRE & EMS OVERVIEW

Spanish Fork Fire & EMS has a long outstanding history and tradition in the community. The Fire Department was organized in 1908 with volunteer firefighters and continues to be served by volunteers today using modern fire equipment and certification standards monitored by the Utah Fire and Rescue Academy. Emergency Medical Services began in the early 1970's by volunteers and has since been expanded into full-time 24/7/365 staffing from both fire stations that provide both Paramedic and AEMT services.

The Spanish Fork Fire & EMS department provides valuable services to our community protecting life and property. The Fire & EMS department responded to a combined total of 3,721 calls for service in 2023 which is a 12.89% increase from 2022.

The Spanish Fork Fire & EMS department is responsible for the largest geographical area in Utah County (584 sq. miles), stretching from West Mountain through Spanish Fork Canyon to Soldier Summit. The department provides multiple services including Fire & Rescue, EMS, Hazardous Materials Operations Response, Interfacility Transports, CPR Training, Public Relation Events, Fire Prevention, and Plan Reviews.

- Responded to a historical 3,721 calls for service, a 12.89% increase from 2022.
- Hired 3 full-time Battalion Chiefs (Robert Ashby, Jon Grangroth, Blake Edwards)
- Hired 3 full-time Firefighter/AEMT's.
- Hired 3 full-time AEMT's.
- Staffed 1 ambulance with full-time personnel.
- Placed into service a 3rd ambulance from 7 am - 7 pm during peak request for service times.
- Implemented new department Mission Statement: "We strive to build and maintain a vibrant city through personable community interactions and innovative Fire & EMS services".
- Implemented department Motto: "Preserve, Save, Serve".
- Purchased and placed into service a Stryker Stair Chair.
- Purchased and placed into service two EMS supply vending machines. One at each station to help track and keep inventory of consumable supplies.
- Replaced and put into service a new PPE extractor at station 61.
- Purchased and installed a structural firefighting PPE dryer at Station 62.
- Upgraded 36 SCBA's to have integrated thermal imaging cameras.
- Purchased and put into service 12 new SCBA's with integrated thermal imaging cameras.
- Purchased 42 sets of new firefighting PPE to replace outdated. non-compliant firefighting PPE.
- Purchased and placed into service 10 Bendix King Radios for wildland firefighting to replace 4 outdated Bendix King Radios.
- Placed into service 4200 ft of 5" large diameter supply hose on all structural firefighting apparatus. This will allow us to maximize fire hydrant supply on working fire incidents.
- Structural fire apparatus crosslays were updated to a corona load.
- Placed an order for a mobile air & light trailer. This will replace the current light tower in the department fleet.
- Placed into service Fire & EMS UTV that is equipped with a stokes, EMS supplies, and a 25 gallon water tank and pump for fire suppression needs.
- Received a Hazardous Material Operations Spill Control and Confinement Trailer through an Emergency Management grant. Once equipped it will go into service in 2024.
- Completed 1012 interfacility transports out of Spanish Fork Hospital.
- Administrative staff offices including Lydia James office were moved to station 61.
- Kay Thomas Perkins was honored for her retirement from the EMS division after 40 years of service.
- Barbra Peterson-Simpson was honored for her retirement from the

- EMS division after her 41 years of service.

- Resolution was signed adopting a new Utah County Multi-Jurisdictional Aid Agreement replacing the outdated/archaic 1995 document.
- Life Safety Inspection Vault agreement was signed and put into place to monitor and collect fees for life safety apertures within buildings in Spanish Fork.
- Placed into service the following paramedic medications: NorEpi, Magnesium, Calcium, and TXA.
- Hired 8 volunteer firefighters to fill vacant spots from attrition.
- Combined Fire & EMS Peer Support monthly newsletter to include the Spanish Fork Police Department.
- Certified 2 members as Peer Support Representatives.
- Fire Marshal Turner was certified as a Youthfiresetter Interventionist through the National Fire Academy.
- Conducted one Youth Firesetter Intervention case.
- Purchased 8 portable radio's to meet P25 standard for 2023.
- Implemented updated department policies/procedures manual.
- Implemented department operating guidelines manual..
- Implemented volunteer fire crew staffing model.
- The Fire & EMS Long Range Master Plan was completed and presented to the city council in their work session.
- Chief Hales was named and served as the Vice-Chair of the Central 911 Operations Committee.
- Chief Hales was named President of the Utah State Firefighters' Association.

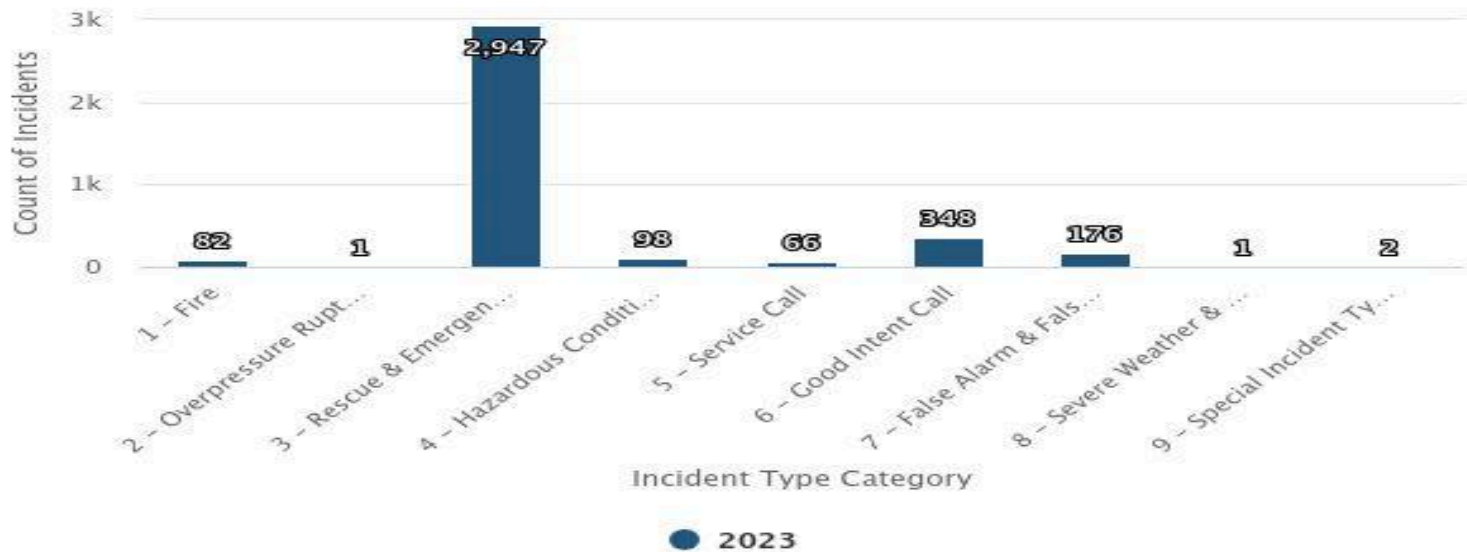
Unit 90th Percentile Turnout Time (Seconds)

Jan 01, 2023 to Dec 31, 2023



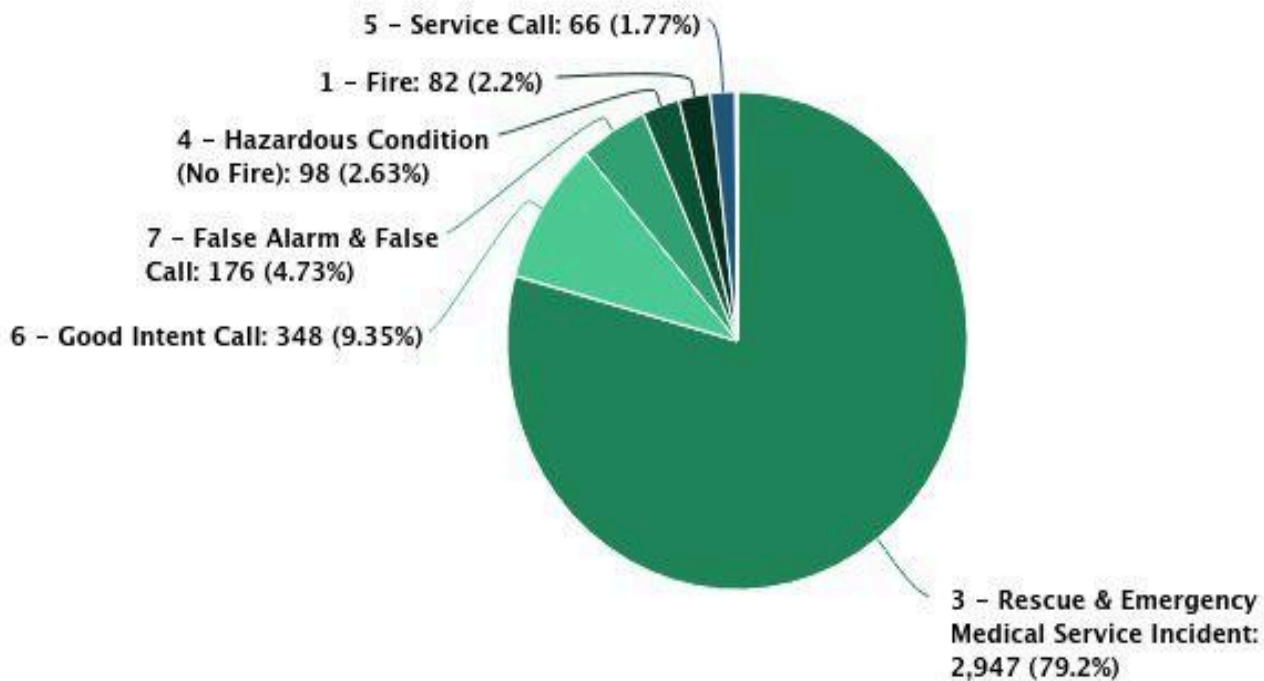

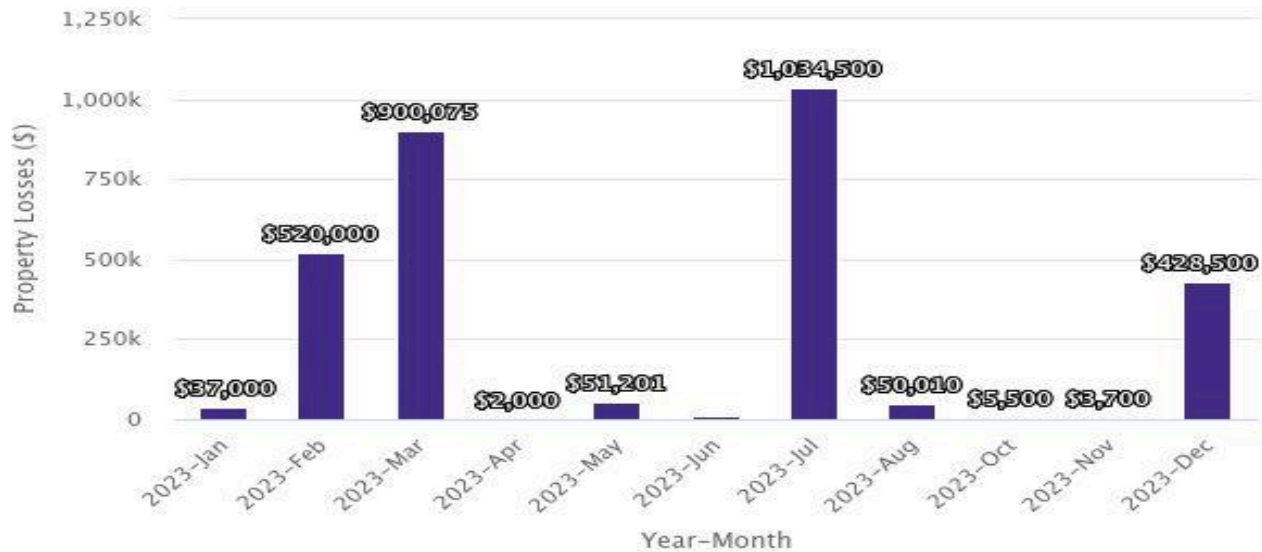

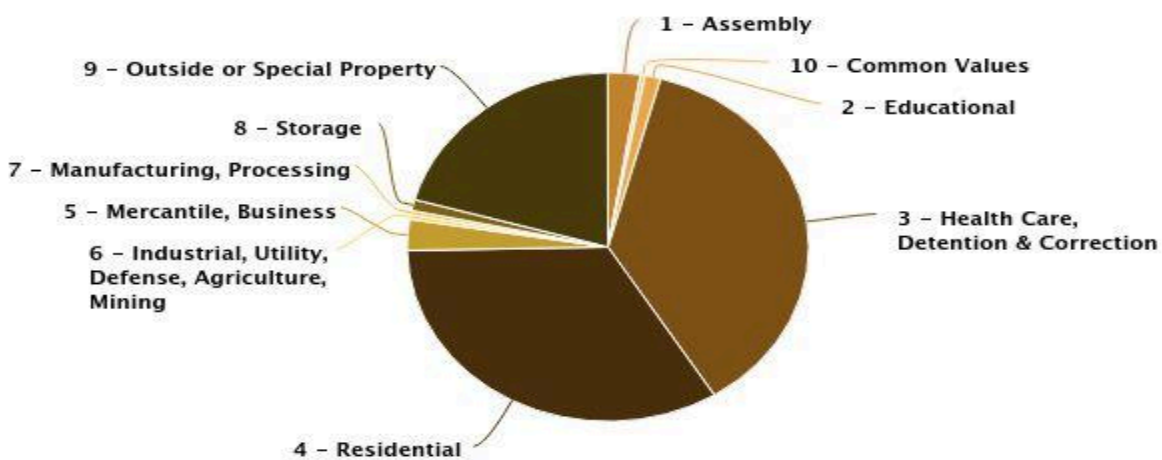
Property Losses by Month

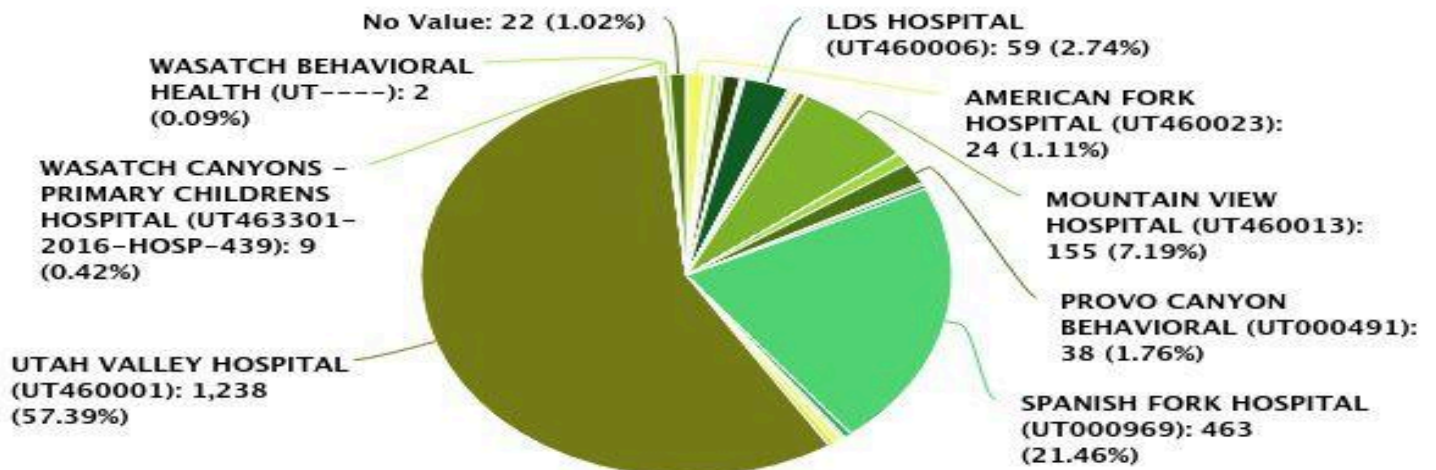

Jan 01, 2023 to Dec 31, 2023



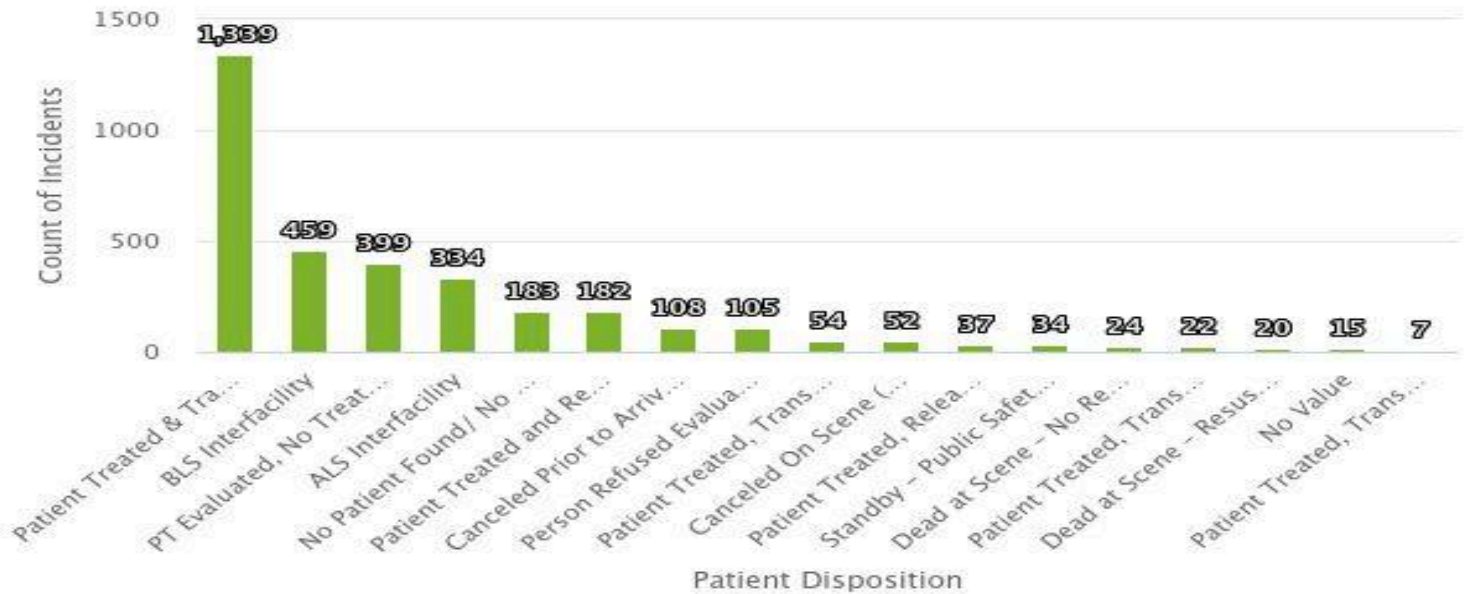
