Landscaping, fences, and snow piles can slow firefighters down during an emergency, so please keep a minimum of three feet of clearance around hydrants. After all, a covered hydrant turns a quick response into a real-life game of hyd(e)-and-seek.

## Crack Seal Repair

During the colder months, you'll often see our streets crews out filling cracks in the roads when cracks are at their widest. Our crews don't crack under pressure but they do use a lot of it, clearing rocks, dirt, and debris with high-pressure air before sealing. Please keep parked vehicles and trailers off the side of the road and keep children safely away.
