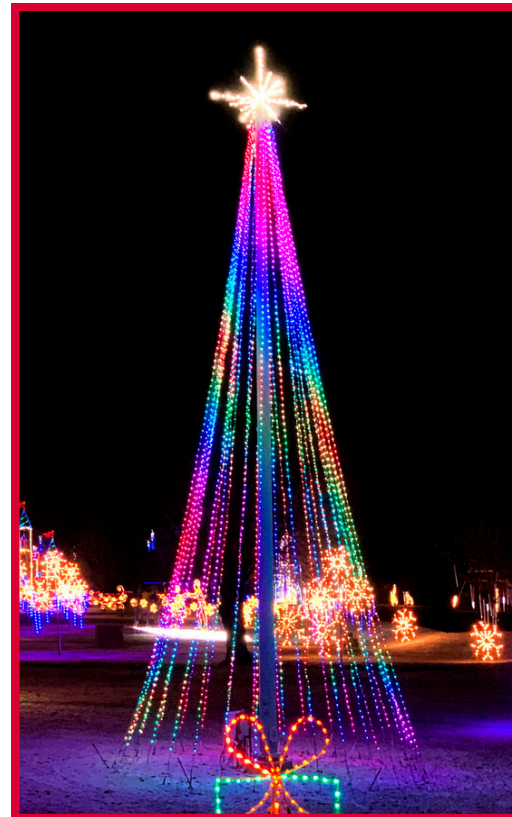

TRASH TALK

On collection day, don't trash the rules! Cans should hit the curb by 7 in the morning and be off the street by evening. Pickup times can roll with the route. Keep everything in the can, no overflow surprises, give your bins some breathing room – about three feet – and don't block sidewalks, mailboxes, or hydrants. In windy areas, secure your cans so they don't go on an un-can-trolled adventure. Together, we can keep Spanish Fork looking bin-credible!
