A WORD ON COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

This is a time of year where we in the Community Development Department see an increase in construction activity throughout the community. For many residents, the most common construction projects involve building fences and accessory buildings. Accessory buildings are structures such as sheds, garages and carports. Spanish Fork City is eager to help make sure that fences and accessory buildings are constructed in a manner that conforms to the City's zoning ordinance.

One thing to remember about constructing accessory buildings and fences is the need for everyone to obtain a Building Permit before construction begins. In order to make it as easy as possible for residents to and fences they construct meet the City's obtain a Building Permit, Spanish Fork City offers fence permits free of charge. Also, permits for any accessory buildings that are less than two-hundred square feet are offered free of charge as well. Typically

these permits can be issued the same day that an application is submitted but we suggest that residents submit their plans a week before they plan to start construction.

The City's greatest concern with the construction of fences and accessory buildings is our effort to ensure that setback requirements are met. For example, the City requires that accessory buildings be at least 5 feet from other accessory buildings and homes. Certain types of fences are not permitted within a certain distance from intersections and driveways. By applying for a permit before beginning construction, residents can be assured that the buildings requirements.
