VOTE BY MAIL

The 2018 General Election will be a Vote-by-Mail election, meaning that ballots will be mailed to registered voters, which you should have already received. While there are several ways to submit your ballot for the election, in all cases, your ballot must be sealed in the ballot envelope and you must sign the envelope. You may submit your ballot by:

- **Mail:** Ballots must be postmarked by Monday, November 5, 2018 to be counted. You will need to pay postage to mail your ballot.
- Drop off at City Offices: A drop-off box will be located in the Utility Office (40 S Main Street, Room 120) until Monday, November 5. You may drop off your ballot on Monday through Friday between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.
- Drop off at Election Service Center: Deliver your ballot on Election Day (Tuesday, November 6) to the Election Service Center at the Senior Citizen Center (167 W Center Street) between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.

BALLOTS MUST BE POSTMARKED BY NOV. 5

VOTE IN PERSON

If you would prefer to vote in person on Election Day, you may visit the Election Service Center at the Senior Citizen Center between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 pm. Please bring your mail-in ballot with you so that it can be destroyed. If you do not bring your ballot, you will be required to vote provisionally so that election officials can verify that your mailed ballot was not already submitted.

SNOWSTORM PARKING

There is now a City ordinance prohibiting residents from parking anything along the street once snow starts accumulating and during snowplow operations for up to 48 hours after a snowstorm. This has the following benefits:



- 1. Our streets will be cleared of snow more quickly and thoroughly.
- 2. Fewer incidents of damaging parked vehicles and trailers by plowing operations.
- 3. Safer plowing conditions, especially on steep roads.
- 4. Nuisance broken down vehicles and trailers will be cleared from the streets regularly.

Plan now to attend the Festival of Lights which begins Thanksgiving Night - Nov. 22 running through New Year's to Jan. 1. The festival is open nightly from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m., at Canyon View Park (3300 E. Powerhouse Road).

This is a family-oriented drive-through display with animated holiday displays. The cost is \$8 per car; \$22 per large passenger van or any vehicle towing a trailer; \$30 per bus.

Cift certificates are available at the Spanish Fork City Office (40 South Main) or at the Parks & Recreation Office (775 N. Main) for \$8. A punch pass for five (5) admissions will also be available for \$35.

No second drive-thru the displays will be allowed from Friday, December 7 through Tuesday, December 25. You may go around again as many times as you wish before December 7 or after December 25.
