#### **DO I NEED A BUILDING PERMIT?**

This is a question we are often asked, and after asking a few follow-up questions, it becomes quite easy to answer.

The Building Code requires a building permit if you intend to construct, alter, repair, move, demolish or change the occupancy of a building or structure, or to erect, install, enlarge, alter, repair, remove, convert or replace any electrical, gas, mechanical, or plumbing system that is regulated by the Building Code.

Examples of projects that **do** require a building permit include building a shed or a fence, replacing a water heater, changing the electrical service or adding solar to your house, adding a generator for backup power, or adding or replacing a deck.

Examples of projects that **do not** require a building permit include changing flooring, replacing light fixtures, driveways or concrete work that meet the City's code requirements, cabinets, countertops, or other finish work.

To find out if your upcoming project requires a building permit, call the Spanish Fork Building Department at (801) 804-4540. It is always easier to ask a question prior to performing any work.

#### **AVOID OVERHEAD LINES**

Extra care needs to be taken when operating near overhead lines. Follow these guidelines when near overhead lines:

- Stay as far away from lines as possible do not get closer than 10 feet
- Use wood or fiberglass ladders
- Look up before using a ladder outside
- Carry ladders down by your side, not with an end up
- Do not trim trees around overhead lines call the City at (801) 804-4541
- Do not plant new trees under power lines
- If you ever see any downed power lines, stay away, keep others away, and call 911.

#### NOTICE TO SPANISH FORK CITY UTILITY CUSTOMERS

State law requires the City to provide an annual disclosure on funds transferred from a utility enterprise fund to any other fund. The City is amending its 2020 annual budget on April 7, 2020. With this budget amendment, the City is planning to transfer additional funds from the Electric Fund to the Streets and Storm Drain Fund. This is the notice given to utility customers about this transfer.

Spanish Fork City has several major projects in the Street and Storm Drain Fund but doesn't have enough funds to complete these important projects for the community. These projects include the following:

- Canyon Creek Parkway, Spanish Fork Parkway and Market Place Drive (around Lowe's);
- Extending Spanish Fork Parkway from 400 North to the IHC Hospital area; and
- Street and Storm Drain improvements near the new All-Abilities Park on Canyon Road.

The proposed budget will transfer 9 million dollars from the Electric Fund to the Streets and Storm Drain Fund. This transfer is of funds which cannot be defined as reasonable allocation of costs between funds. This amount will not be repaid. The funds are being withdrawn from Electric Reserves.

The amount of the transfer is as follows:

A public hearing will be held on Tuesday, April 7, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. at the City Council Chambers located in the Spanish Fork City Offices at 40 South Main Street, Spanish Fork, Utah. The hearing will be broadcast on SF17, SFCN.org, Facebook Live, and YouTube. The public hearing will be to discuss the proposed transfers in the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget. The fiscal year begins July 1, 2019 and ends June 30, 2020.
