GREAT UTAH SHAKEOUT

The annual Great Utah Shakeout drill will be held on Thursday, April 15 at 10:15 a.m. As a mock earthquake, the City will use this drill as a functional exercise to test various as-



pects of disaster response. You should expect to receive an emergency notification around 10:15 a.m. and may notice extra emergency and City vehicles "responding" during the drill.

GARBAGE AND RECYCLE CANS

Please make sure all garbage cans are out before 7 a.m. on your assigned collection day no matter when your garbage cans are typically picked up. Routes are constantly changing as the City grows. See the Garbage Truck Routes Map for up -to-date collection day info at spanishfork.org/garbage.

It is important that vehicles or trailers are not blocking cans. Cans must not be filled with dirt, sod, asphalt, burned out charcoal/ashes, or large appliances that make the can too heavy for the garbage truck arm to lift. Make sure lids remain closed so rain and snow cannot get into cans, weighing down the garbage and contaminating the recyclable materials.

CEMETERY SPRING CLEANUP

The Cemetery Spring cleanup is planned for Monday, April 26. We invite patrons to remove valued decorations on or before Sunday, April 25 so they won't get discarded by the cemetery staff.

Now is also a good time to remove extra shepherd hooks. The decorations policy states that one shepherd hook or vertical structure is allowed for each burial position. Beginning June 7, 2021, shepherd hooks will only be allowed November through February and the week of Memorial Day.
